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<u>Purpose</u>

Middle school orchestra is offered to beginning sixth grade students as well as seventh and eighth grade intermediate and advanced students. The purpose of this course is to enhance, enrich, and build a solid instrumental music foundation of performance skills. The courses are performance-based which afford students the opportunity to showcase their talents in class as well as out of class in small and large group performances. The curriculum is comprehensive for all orchestra instruments and facilitates growth at all levels of skill and talents. It is the goal of the Taylor Road Middle School Orchestra to instill a lifelong love of music and playing in our students.

Instrumental Music Participation Fee

Students participating in orchestra will be charged a **fee of \$65 per year**. This fee will be used to offset the cost of guest clinicians, concert polos, t-shirts, awards, rewards, transportation, music, and materials. Families with financial concern should reach out to the director to work out other arrangements.

Please submit the payment through Online School Payment (OSP) by **September 10th**, **2024** through OSP (Online School Payment) on the TRMS Website. Link provided through our orchestra website.

Materials

Orchestra Instrument

Students are **expected** to rent an instrument from a local music store. It is extremely beneficial for you and your student to rent from a local music store with high quality products. Music stores will adequately maintain and repair any damages to the instrument. Music stores typically exchange rental instruments when your student outgrows them. However, if there is a financial concern regarding rental, please reach out to Mrs. Paul-Nally and Ms. Wilson as soon as possible.

Method Books:

Sixth Grade – Essentials Elements for Strings – Book 1** Seventh Grade – Essentials Elements for Strings – Book 2** Eighth Grade – method books will be provided in class.

**This year, all method books will be supplied to students, no purchase necessary. However, if a student loses the provided book, they must purchase a replacement.

Orchestra Supplies:

Binders, sheet protectors, t-shirts, and concert polos will all be provided this year through the participation fee.

Students who choose to play violin or viola are required to have their own shoulder rest. These can be purchased from any music store, or Amazon. Please consult Ms. Paul for proper sizes.

Rosin: It is recommended that each student have their own rosin, it can be purchased from any music store.

Soft cloth: for wiping down strings after playing. Old wash clothes or cut up t-shirts work great!

Shoulder rest: for violins and violas only. Be sure to try with instrument before purchasing.

Rock stop: for cello and basses.

10-15 pages of lined notebook paper

Pencil(s)- to be kept in your case, binder, or instrument cubby

Music stand for home practice/ field trips (folding wire stand)

Instrument Storage:

Each student will be assigned a place to keep their instrument. Students will receive this assignment during the first few weeks of school. All instruments must be stored in the proper place.

- Your name should be on your case, book, shoulder rest, and rock stop. Ms. Paul will help you label everything with masking tape.
- *Violins and violas keep a soft cloth in your case.*
- Violins and violas keep their cases under or next to their chair, make sure it is closed!
- Each student is responsible for putting away their instrument and music at the end of class.
- Books and music binders can be kept in the instrument cubby (for violins and violas) or an assigned bookshelf. Students may also keep these materials in their bookbags to take home for home practice.

Instrument Rental

All students are **expected** to rent instruments from the local music stores as the quality of the instruments is much higher. Many music stores have rent-to-own programs that allow you to contribute your monthly payments to the price of the instrument. Flyers and information will be sent home on recommended shops in the area. However, if there is a financial concern regarding instrument rental, please reach out to Mrs. Paul-Nally as soon as possible.

We **strongly advise against the purchase of instruments online. You get what you pay for, and many instruments purchased online will easily break and not be sustainable for your students use. Please consult Mrs. Paul-Nally and Ms. Wilson before any rentals or purchases online.**

Performance Attire

The Taylor Road Orchestra performance attire consists of the following:

Sixth/Seventh Grade White TRMS Orchestra Polo, black dress pants, black dress

shoes, black flats, or 1" heels (black socks)

Eighth Grade Black TRMS Orchestra Polo, black dress pants, black dress

shoes, black flats, or 1" heels (black socks)

Absolutely no sandals, flip flops, sneakers, white socks, or

black jeans.

Orchestra concerts are considered formal events for our students, and it is very important that students look their best for each performance. Please address uniform issues long before the concert date. Students who arrive for a concert without acceptable clothing will not be allowed to participate in the event. If you have a problem obtaining an outfit, please contact the director or principal as soon as possible, so we can work together to resolve this matter.

Performance Attendance

Students are expected to attend all performances and rehearsals unless a director has approved an acceptable excuse *two weeks prior to the performance or rehearsal*. Good communication between teachers, students, and parents can prevent misunderstandings. Students who do not attend a performance must submit a recording of their concert music within 48 hours the concert or performance. Failure to submit a recording will result in points deducted from the students playing test grade.

Orchestra performances are intended to showcase the students' hard work and are also designed to teach stage and audience etiquette. Therefore, students are expected to behave in a courteous and professional manner before, during, and after all performances.

Performance attendance and make-ups are required for students attending any orchestra field trips. Students who do not meet these requirements will be asked not to participate in these special events. Field trips area reward (not a privilege) for the hard

work these students put forth throughout the year and their dedication to the orchestra program.

Grading

Grades for all instrumental music classes are reported on a nine-week basis and are based on the following:

- Daily class participation and performance
- Playing and written exams
- Homework assignments, which includes home practice

Grades for orchestra are numeric grades and conduct grades consistent with Fulton County policy

Expectations

We make every effort to teach students more than just the vocational skills they will need to work. In orchestra, students are expected to learn and demonstrate a strong work ethic, professional and respectful conduct, and good communication skills that are required in every workplace. In class and especially in the community, students are expected to:

- Show up early to events
- Prepared with the materials and attitude they need to perform their best
- With a respectful, responsible, and positive demeanor toward themselves, each other, and their teachers, parents, and community members

Rules and Consequences

- 1. Be on time to class and early to every rehearsal and performance.
- 2. Bring the materials you need- your instrument, music, and a pencil- and not the ones you don't: phones, work for another class, food/ drink (other than water), or other distractions.
- 3. Follow instructions the first time they are given.
- 4. Speak or play your instrument only when you've been instructed to do so.
- 5. Be respectful to yourself, your peers, your teacher, and the materials.

Students who choose to break the rules are also choosing to receive the following consequences:

- First offense—Verbal or visual warning and conference with teacher after class
- Second offense—Parent/Guardian contact
- Third offense Parent/Guardian contact and detention
- Fourth offense—referred to administration immediately

Rental Supply List

Bring this list with you to the music store when you rent your student's instrument. It will help guide you in collecting all required materials. Remember, a quality instrument is an investment in your child's musical education. If you have any questions, please let me know!

6th grade students will be sent home with a specific check-list within the first month of school, including their correct instrument size.

- ❖ Instrument of choice in **proper size** (Violin, viola, cello, or bass)**
 - o Students should be measured in the store for the correct sized instrument
 - Proper sized bow
 - o Instrument case
- ❖ Shoulder rest for violins and violas: try with instrument before leaving to ensure a proper fit
- Rock stop for celli and bass
- Cleaning cloth: for wiping down instrument after use
- Rosin for bow: can be purchased at any music store
- Spare strings (highly recommended)
- Folding music stand (recommended but not required)

Most beginning students (6th graders) will not be on a full-sized instrument
